3. **PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION REGARDING THE MEMORIAL GARDEN WITHIN THE PAT HALLISEY PARK PROJECT**

Parks and Recreation Director Chien Wei introduced Blake Coleman, Principal with TBG Partners, who gave a presentation on the proposed Pat Hallisey Park-Memorial.

The Site and its History:

- Texas Killing Fields is an area along I-45, where 34 victims have been discovered, primarily young women.
- Many of these cases remain unsolved
- Four victims were found in League City, Texas between 1984 and 1991: Heidi Villareal-Fye, 23; Laura Miller, 16; Audrey Lee Cook, 30; and Donna Gonsoulin Prudhomme, 34.

The League City Council vision for the memorial is not limited to just a memorial. It seeks a meaningful destination that draws people in and allows for a community gathering to celebrate life.

The purpose is to create a memorial that will serve as a space of remembrance, healing and community awareness, and honor 4 League City victims.
