Street Lighting

Who is Tanko Lighting?

Sole Focus – Municipal Streetlighting Consultant 927,000+ Streetlights in Contract 523,000+ Streetlight Acquisitions 73,000+ Fixtures Maintained 260+ Projects Nationwide

League City Streetlighting – Current Situation TNMP owns the majority of the lighting system, high costs, limited control, antiquated technology Opportunity to acquire the system, reduce operating costs, modernize lighting system (LED), improve nighttime public safet

Feasibility Study Considered 5 scenarios Option 5, acquisition of lighting system and immediate LED conversion provides lowest operating costs and best ROI

Summary of Estimated Findings (Slide)

Benefits of Ownership: Reduced Costs Control of Streetscape Modernized Lighting System Improved Public Safety Guaranteed Service Levels

Option 1 Overview TNMP Current Monthly Cost - \$14.12 (100w HPS) (72% of system) LED Conversion, remaining with TNMP Estimated New Monthly Cost - \$29.32 (35w LED) Option 5 Overview TNMP Current Monthly Cost - \$14.12 monthly cost LED conversion, League City takes ownership Estimated New Monthly Cost \$3.75

Total Cost \$4,706.523 20 Year Savings \$13,345,643 Payback Period (Energy + Maintenance Savings) 6.68 years

Year 1 Analysis Energy Usage (kWh) Existing Cost - \$3,039,360 New Cost - \$828,900 Savins - \$2,210,460

Maintenance Options Streetlight Operations & Maintenance In-house program, 100% outsourced via bid, guaranteed response times, proactive maintenance

Christopher Sims, Executive Director of Development Services New Development Streetlights – Current Development TNMP currently installs/maintains LED streetlights for new development Approx. 125 new streetlights/yr Taking ownership saves City \$25/pole/month

Next steps – Ordinance amendment for city ownership Implementation of City Lighting Policy Legacy Development would be first subdivision for City ownership

Design Policy Highlights Continuous lighting for collectors and arterials

Typical Spacing – at intersections, 300-500' feet on local roads 250' on collectors, 200' on arterials

Preferred installation locations -3' from curb, alternating roadside for 2-lane roads, median placement or on both sides of road for 4-land roads

2 yr. maintenance bond requirement

Next steps – Lighting audit/system evaluation, negotiate & acquire system from TNMP, LED Conversion
