3. <u>DISCUSSION REGARDING THE CITY OF LEAGUE CITY FY2024-2028 CAPITAL</u> IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND PROPOSED FY2024 BUDGET

John Baumgartner, City Manager, gave remarks introducing the proposed FY2024-2028 Capital Improvement Plan and proposed FY2024 Budget.

Just kind of an introduction for tonight. I know we have a stop at 7:45 with a hard stop at 8 o'clock, due to scheduling commitments. We'll try to get you out of here quickly. Angie will go through the CIP high level overview, and then if you've got questions about anything that she talks about or specific projects, or what have you. We're going to focus on primarily short term what are we doing in 24, maybe we'll talk about 25, yes. The out years are a little more of a challenge. We've constrained it a little more than we have in the past, financially. If there's not an identifiable funding source, we've put it on a list of, hey, here's some great ideas, it's in the book on page six. It's getting to be a fairly long list, about \$300-400 million, but until we come up with a funding source it's difficult to add, particularly new tax supported projects. Obviously, the projects that are supported by 4B, parks funds, water, sewer revenues are a little bit easier to manage our way through. Most of those come with master plans that we're working toward a funding goal.
