## Notes

Note 1. Example of total fee collected. [Base Fee + FACP + 0 -10 devices + 50% plan review fee]  
Proposed plan - [\$200.00 + \$150.00 + \$100.00 = \$450.00 + \$225.00 = \$675.00]

Note 2. Amusement Buildings – Halloween Haunted houses or similar structures.

Note 3. Carnival and Fairs – Fire inspections of tents, rides, and other hazards.

Note 4. Dry Cleaning Plants – only if the plant produces the dry cleaning process in house using hazardous chemicals or solvents. Plants that only receive and ship orders do not fall into this category.

Note 5. Exhibit and Trade Shows – Special events or trade shows. These events can either be indoor or outdoor events.

Note 6. Fumigation and Thermal Fogging – insecticidal fogging operations inside structures using hazardous or flammable common fumigants. Does not regulate other regular pest or insecticide control operations.

Note 7. HPM (Hazardous Production Materials) - Semiconductors manufacturing and storage. Hazardous

Materials associated with the manufacturing of semiconductors.

Note 8. Temporary Membrane Structures & Tents – tents having an area in excess of 400 square feet. Many times during special holidays, tents are erected to sale merchandise to the public that exceed 400 square feet. At times, they are enclosed and could present a hazard for egress or flame impingement, especially if they are not certified.

Note 9. Food Truck Permit was renamed in the 2021 IFC to Mobile Food Preparation Vehicles.

Note 10. Fire Watch – at times, a fire suppression or fire protection system may be out of service causing a system not to operate in the normal manner. When the system is out of service an approved fire watch is required. Therefore, a properly trained individual is required to operate within the scope of the code until the system is back in service. A certified watch may also be required when a mass gathering of people presents a hazard or unsafe condition. This fee is directly paid to the person or individual completing such work.
