2. PRESENTATION REGARDING FY2022-2023 RECOMMENDED HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS

John Baumgartner, City Manager gave opening remarks. We want to go over some of the changes to the health care plan. They're fairly significant. One of the ways we try to manage costs is how we share the burden of those costs. Lots of them go to the City but we're also making significant changes, primarily to the people who use the plan regularly. It's premiums, it's max out-of-pocket and it's deductibles. I thought it would important for James (Brumm) to go over that as we go through the budget conversations because it's all impacted by that.

James Blumm, Director of Human Resources gave a presentation.

Why are changes being made to Plan? Claims cost continue to rise each year. \$600K in fund balance is estimated to be used in FY2022 and \$455K in FY2023 and is not sustainable

FY2021 Actual Ending Fund Balance - \$3,708,050 FY2022 Estimate Ending Fund Balance - \$3,104,164 FY2023 Proposed Budget Ending Fund Balance - \$2,648,380

Proposed Changes to Plan - Increase deductibles, increase max out-of-pocket, changes in coinsurance, increase premiums

Deductible Changes

Buy-up Plan: From \$500 to \$750 for individual From \$1,000 to \$1,500 for family

Mid-Plan:

From \$1,000 to \$1,250 for individual From \$2,000 to \$2,500 for family

HDHP/HSA – No change

Max out-of pocket Changes Buy-up Plan: From \$2,000 to \$3,000 for individual From \$4,000 to \$6,000 for family

Mid Plan:

From \$3,500 to \$4,500 for individual From \$6,000 to \$9,000 for family

HDHP/HSA – No change

Coinsurance Changes

In Network: Employee portion from 15% to 20% Out of Network: Employee portion from 40% to 50%

Coinsurance \$5,237

Employee Premium Changes - Employee Contribution

Mid Plan:

From \$15 to \$25 for individual From \$422.80 to \$461.35 for family

HSA Plan:

No change for individual From \$213.13 to \$228.05 for family

Buy Up Plan:

From \$92.67 to \$111.20 for individual From \$662.07 to \$794.48 for family

City Premium Changes - City Contribution

Mid Plan:

From \$709.60 to \$792.16 for individual From \$1,823.46 to \$2,071.84 for family

HSA Plan:

From \$630.42 to \$710.95 for individual From \$1,741.05 to \$1,975.75 for family

Buy Up:

From \$708.88 to \$792.73 for individual

From \$1,113.86 to \$1,214.99 for family

Medical Plans (chart)

Coinsurance percentages and copay amounts represent what the member is responsible for paying. Some benefits require that the deductible be met before the Plan begins to pay. If you use an out-of-network provider, you will be responsible for any charges above the usual and customary allowed amount.
