Keith Gross said I want to welcome everybody to the city council meeting. One thing I'd like to talk about is voting. Your participation in government is significant. When we make decisions and it affects the people, it's easy to sit and play Monday-morning quarterback and complain, but I would encourage people to get proactive and participate and let your voice be heard prior to the decision making. I welcome every person living in the League City area to either call me on the phone or send me an email and say Councilman Gross, this is how I feel on this particular decision. I would request that you vote in accordance with my way of thinking. By doing it that way, you may give me some insight as to the reasons why you would urge me to vote in a particular fashion and maybe something that I haven't thought of. And by that way, you participate in government. You might have an effect on the overall outcome of something and it's a better way rather than complain as that Monday morning quarterbacking...it could've, would've, should've happened this way, so my message to the people in the community is contact us and let us know how you feel before something is put to a vote. I will respond to the emails and I will let you know the basis for my vote on each and every vote. There are some people that participate and write on the Galveston Daily News forum that are very critical of us here on council and some of the reasons they have, have merit. I would like to urge these people, I would like to hear from you before the votes cast. I'll justify my vote beforehand and I'll tell you how I intend to vote on it and if need be I'll discuss it with you on the phone. You have a right to ask that of your elected officials. I would just encourage you to take advantage of that.

Nick Long said I would like to thank everybody for coming out to the Fourth of July Celebration at League Park. They served over 5,000 hotdogs, that's an astonishing amount. There were tons of people that came out there for all the different events. It's really neat to get that kind of large scale community gathering and I definitely want to give a big shout out to the staff for putting that together, taking their time on the fourth of July to get that done. I also thought it was neat that it was done during the day. Everyone else does fireworks so this was a little unique that League City did it during the day. Another neat thing that's going to happen is Chat With The Chief. I applaud the Chief for putting this together. This will be held in the Civic Center instead of the library.

Heidi Hansing said welcome everyone. First and foremost, I would like to say publicly that my thoughts are with Councilwoman Bentley and her husband as they're going through a very difficult and life and death situation, so our thoughts and prayers are with them. I would also like to thank MarBella. I've learned a lot through this situation from interaction with a group that didn't even exist as a community prior to this event. I've learned a lot from you. I've learned a lot from your engagement, your passion, and your insights. So for that I'm very appreciative but probably most and foremost vou have inspired me and I'm thankful for that as well. You make me want to strive always for a very high standard of excellence so I credit you with that, your civic engagement. Sometimes after a few years in a job you need that kick in the pants. Lastly, many of you may remember with some fondness a World War II Veteran that was honored at the Salute to Heroes. His name was Ted Jones. You will recall that our staff and Roy Green and Councilman Kinsey really worked to honor him at the Salute to Heroes event because it appeared that his health was failing so greatly that his time was very short. That was no exaggeration. I'm sad to say that Mr. Jones passed away this week and the American Legion Post at Ellington is going to be honoring him. His wake was today. I wasn't able to go because it was in Pearland and it was one hour before this meeting so unfortunately I wasn't able to go to that but tomorrow if you are interested, if you would like to perhaps pay respects. He came in here with his family. He was in critical failing health. Many thanks to the rest of council and the Mayor, they issued a proclamation in his honor and he was so thrilled and his family was so blessed. So his celebration of life is tomorrow if anybody would be interested in going. His funeral is at 11:00 a.m. followed by graveside service, but if you'd like to go to the American Legion Post 490 the celebration of life will be there and it's going to be a good old Texas send off. It's going to have a lot of barbeque and fixings so if you'd like to honor one of the greatest generation you can show up there tomorrow around 1:30 p.m. or 2:00 p.m. at the American Legion Post 490.

10. REPORTS FROM STAFF MEMBERS

Mark Rohr, City Manager, said I have a couple of items, if I could. First is an introduction. Angelica "Angel" Lopez has joined the City as our new Communication Director on June 29, 2015. She earned her Bachelors of Arts Degree in Communications with a Minor in Public Relations and Psychology from Texas A&M, Corpus Christi. Angel also received public affairs accreditation from the Defense Information School, Fort Meade, Maryland. She comes to us with a long time community relations and public affairs background. She most recently held the position of Public Affairs Chief for the 87th Air Base Wing in New She is responsible for disseminating timely and accurate information to the residents of the City of League City, community and business stake holders and various media outlets through varies means including League City television, LCTV 16, the City's municipal television station, City Matters, our quarterly newsletter, the City's website and social media, opportunities, press releases, media interviews and responding to media queries, public outreach efforts and activities. We wish her luck in her new position with the City of League City. I also had another request on an item that council received some correspondence on today from the Planning Director. In order to shed some light on that particular issue we thought it was important to get that information out early on and I would like to call on Paul Menzies to come up and share that information with the council and the public.

Paul Menzies, Director of Planning and Development, said I just want to update the council on some of the pending development in Beacon Island. Obviously South Shore Harbour, kind of the pinnacle of our community, and this last piece of development has always piqued a lot of folks' interests and so I thought it was important to update everyone where that is. Within the last two weeks, the developer/owner of Beacon Island has submitted to the City four building permits for single family patio homes. Two of those permits have been issued. At what time construction actually starts, that will be up to him. Nonetheless, I just wanted to confirm that has occurred. Again, South Shore Harbour's long thirty-five year history, upon my arrival a little more than a year ago one of the first folks that had asked me to meet with them were the representatives for the Families for the Response Development of Beacon Island and so Tom and I have had a pretty open dialog with regards to the history. He's gotten me up to speed on a lot of things. And in that, the staff, me personally, I'm crystal clear on their position as to development regulations on Beacon Island, what they are, why they think that way, and when they were conveyed to them to lead them to that end. When the permits came in, we reviewed them based on what we have on the books, the zoning in place, the master plan approvals, the plats that have been approved, specifically within the last few years. A number of decisions have been made to lead to this end and the building permits were reviewed based on those active and approved plans, the building codes that we have in place and they were issued.
