1. <u>CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS</u>

Mayor Hallisey called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and called the roll. All members of Council were present.

2. FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES

16-1253

Consider and take action on an ordinance approving an ad valorem tax rate for the City of League City, Texas, upon all taxable property within the corporate limits of the City for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2017; directing the assessment and collection thereof; providing for a severability clause; and providing for an effective date (Assistant City Manager)

Staff requests first and final reading.

A motion was made by Mr. Long, seconded by Mr. Dugie, to approve first and final reading of this ordinance. The motion passed by the following vote:

For: 8 - Mayor Hallisey, Mr. Becker, Mr. Dugie, Ms. Hansing, Mr. Kinsey, Ms. Bentley, Mr. Gross and Mr. Long

A motion was made by Mr. Long, seconded by Mr. Dugie, to approve setting the tax rate at the effective tax rate of \$0.550866. The motion failed by the following vote:

For: 3 - Mayor Hallisey, Mr. Dugie and Mr. Long

Opposed: 5 - Mr. Becker, Ms. Hansing, Mr. Kinsey, Ms. Bentley and Mr. Gross

A motion was made by Mr. Kinsey, seconded by Mr. Becker, that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.5735, which is effectively a 4.11% increase in the tax rate.

An amended motion was made by Mr. Dugie, seconded by Mr. Long, that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.5592 (Alt 1) which is effectively a 1.513% increase in the tax rate. The motion failed by the following vote:

For: 4 - Mayor Hallisey, Mr. Dugie, Ms. Hansing and Mr. Long

Opposed: 4 - Mr. Becker, Mr. Kinsey, Ms. Bentley and Mr. Gross

An amended motion was made by Mr. Dugie, seconded by Mr. Long, that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.5665 (Alt 2) which is effectively a 2.8% increase, which would decrease the property tax rate but also increase the revenue from property tax this year. The motion failed by the following vote:

For: 4 - Mayor Hallisey, Mr. Dugie, Ms. Hansing and Mr. Long

Opposed: 4 - Mr. Becker, Mr. Kinsey, Ms. Bentley and Mr. Gross

The motion made by Mr. Kinsey, seconded by Mr. Becker, to set the tax rate at \$0.5735 failed by the following vote:

For: 4 - Mr. Becker, Mr. Kinsey, Ms. Bentley and Mr. Gross

Opposed: 4 - Mayor Hallisey, Mr. Dugie, Ms. Hansing and Mr. Long

A motion was made by Mr. Long, seconded by Mr. Becker, to approve Ordinance No. 2016-35 to provide that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.57, which is effectively a 3.47% increase in the tax rate. The motion passed by the following vote:

For: 8 - Mayor Hallisey, Mr. Becker, Mr. Dugie, Ms. Hansing, Mr. Kinsey, Ms. Bentley, Mr. Gross and Mr. Long

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At 6:30 p.m. Mayor Hallisey said, there being no further business this meeting is adjourned.
