#### 3. <u>PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF GALVESTON COUNTY WCID # 12</u> <u>EMERGENCY WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT</u>

Derek Hughes, Assistant to the City Manager, gave a presentation.

The City received a letter from the General Manager for Galveston Control and Improvement District #12 (GCWCID). They are seeking an emergency water agreement which will create a connection from League City on SH 96 near our eastern boundary to WCID #12. The agreement will provide for emergency water support in case of a supply issue. Currently WCID #12 is serviced by a 12" line from the Galveston County Water Authority (GCWA) Thomas Mackey Facility in Texas City, running along SH146 and is their single supply line. It is not looped into ours so if there is an issue between them and the Thomas Mackey Facility they have issue getting service. With this proposed connection, if the Thomas Mackey Facility was not able to service WCID #12 in the event of line or pump failure then League City would be able to support them. Staff will be refining the agreement with WCID #12 for council approval in June. There are no obligations for service if League City customers are negatively impacted. We would charge them a whole sale rate per 1,000/gallons and there would be an adjustment negotiable as a percentage of the CPI.

John Baumgartner added, I am not aware of a situation where they have needed this service but with the construction on SH 146 there could be a line break. What I have conveyed to them in previous conversations over the last year was in the winter time there are no issues quantity wise for us to supply them water but in the summer it would be difficult for us to provide them water. Their total supply is about 1 million gallons per day. We look at this as a good neighbor policy. If we had a supply issue from Houston or Thomas Mackey we would talk to GCWA to get additional water pumped to us. This would be just for emergency supply.
