

**RESOLUTION CONTINUING
DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER
FOR THE CITY OF LEAGUE CITY, TEXAS**

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of League City, Texas declared a local state of disaster on August 25, 2017, due to imminent threat from Hurricane Harvey;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), the declaration of local state of disaster may not be continued or renewed for a period of more than seven (7) days except with the consent of the City Council of the City of League City;

WHEREAS, the City of League City has suffered widespread catastrophic flooding that has caused severe property damage and displaced hundreds of residents from Hurricane Harvey;

WHEREAS, flood waters remain an imminent threat to life and property in League City;

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of League City has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property;
NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEAGUE CITY, TEXAS, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of League City, Texas, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), hereby consents to continuing the declaration of local state of disaster for the City of League City, Texas.

Section 2. The declaration of local state of disaster for the City of League City, Texas, resulting from Hurricane Harvey is therefore continued;

Section 3. This declaration continuing a local state of disaster shall be effective for thirty (30) days on and from its date of issuance, provided however that this declaration may be terminated before the expiration of thirty days by subsequent order of the Mayor, and may be continued or renewed beyond thirty days from its date of issuance only with the consent of the City Council of the City of League City, Texas;

Section 4. This declaration continues the activation of the City's Emergency Management Plan;

Section 5. This declaration continues the activation of the recovery and rehabilitation aspects of all applicable local or interjurisdictional emergency management plans and authorizes the furnishing of aid and assistance under the declaration;

Section 6. The Mayor may continue to control ingress to and egress from a disaster in the city and the movement of persons and the occupancy of premises in that area;

Section 7. This declaration shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary; and

Section 8. This declaration shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
