2. <u>DISCUSS AND DEVELOP THE STRATEGIC PLAN FOR THE CITY OF LEAGUE CITY</u>

Julia Novak, President of The Novak Consulting Group led the City Council in the strategic planning process.

Strategic Planning Process

At its most basic level, a strategic plan exists to answer three questions:

- What do we know to be true today?
- Where do we want to be in the future?
- How can we get there?

The process for League City has included the following steps to date:

- Individual interviews with Julia Novak and the Mayor and members of the City Council
- Meeting with City Department Heads
- Employee Survey
- March 26 Retreat with Department and Division Managers of the City to develop a draft Strategic Planning Framework for Council consideration.

Typically, the framework includes some combination of the following elements:

- Vision the Vision Statement is aspirational, intended to reflect what you hope will be true for League City in the future.
- Mission the role and purpose of City government, frequently expressed in statements about "who we are, what we do, and why we do it."
- Values organizational values guide behavior, whether stated or unstated, and are observed when the workforce is "at its best."
- Outcome Areas or Critical Success Factors those "things that must go well" in order for the City of League City to be a successful.

Once a framework is in place, an organization can align projects, programs, and priority initiatives and see how they contribute to making the Vision a reality. The work that has been done to date with both the City Council and the City employees has positioned us to have a draft framework.

- Vision the consultants presented a draft Vision Statement that reflected what the City Council shared about their hopes for the future during individual interviews. We want the City Council to "own" the Vision for the organization.
- Mission & Values City staff presented the draft mission and values that they developed during the March 26 retreat. Their work honored input from nearly 300 employees who took time to participate in a survey. The Council was invited to make adjustments.
- Outcome Areas or Critical Success Factors developed by the City Department and Division Managers on March 26. The Council considered the final outcome areas for the City.
- Priorities new programs, projects, and policies were identified by the City Council.
