PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City has a partnership, through a Texas Parks & Wildlife Department Recreation Trail Grant opportunity, to construct a 5K Hike & Bike Trail on the grounds of Hometown Heroes Park. The 10' wide decomposed granite trail will run in its entirety, off road, and within the confines of Hometown Heroes Park. The total estimated cost of the project is \$1,493,300. This opportunity will use \$1,293,300 of City funds, and a \$200,000 grant from the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department. The City's contribution will come from 4B funds. The 4B Board approved funding support at the January 2015 meeting, with the understanding that approval of this project may delay a portion of the 2012 Hike & Bike Phase 1 Project (PK 1202). The 4B Board felt this was an excellent opportunity to leverage its funds and reprioritize its projects since grant funds are available. This project is now in the current 2017 Parks, Trails, and Open Space Master Plan. The 5K Loop trail will be maintained by the City.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

Construction will provide a safer route for those who train for 5K running events. It will provide the only decomposed granite loop trail in the City. It will also provide the City an alternative route to host 5K runs. Races can be held at Hometown Heroes Park without having to close down numerous streets all around town for a race. This project is eligible for Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Grant Funding. Deadline is February 1, 2019. Funds for the city's match must be available at the time of the application.
