1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

2. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION REGARDING LONG TERM WATER SUPPLY

The presentation was given by Director of Public Works, Jody Hooks. Mr. Ivan Langford, Consultant and former General Manager of Gulf Coast Water Authority, was present to answer questions.

Water Supply Contract Amendment

Presentation Goals:

- Provide summary of Gulf Coast Water Authority's (GCWA) role as City of League City's (COLC) water purveyor.
- Provide general summary of the Third Amendment to the 1971 Surface Water Supply Contract.
- Introduce details of two key elements of the City's future water supply encompassed in the proposed Amendment
- Summarize current and future water supply utilization
- Summarize associated financials
- October 8 Council Agenda for consideration of approval

GCWA's role as water purveyor:

- Serves as COLC's water purveyor for surface water supplies since 1971
- Manages multiple surface water supply contracts for municipal, industrial, and agricultural customers
- GCWA is the contractual co-participant with City of Houston (COH) on behalf of COLC for Southeast Transmission Line (SETL) and Southeast Water Purification Plant (SEWPP) (22.5 MGD)
- COLC has surface water supply contract with GCWA for treated surface water from their Thomas Mackey Water Treatment Plant (2.554 MGD)

Water Supply Contract Summary:

- Third Amendment to the original 1971 Surface Water Supply Contract with GCWA
- This proposed amendment addresses two key elements of the City's surface water supply for ultimate build-out:
 - ☐ The replacement and capacity increase of the existing 42-inch SETL from SEWPP to the City's SH3 Booster Pump Station (BPS)
 - ☐ The Untreated Water Reservation Agreement for 20 MGD of raw water capacity from the COH
- Amendment also adds clarification of 80/20 percent cost share of future replacement of 42/39-inch waterline between COCL's SH3 BPS and GCWA's Calder Rd Meter Station
- Consolidates all existing agreements between GCWA and COLC

SETL Summary:

- The proposed project replaces approximately 10 miles of the existing 42-inch waterline that has been in service for 50 years
- The project includes increasing waterline capacity to accommodate 36.5 MGD of existing and future surface water supply
- Through GCWA, the City is one of seven co-participants in the operation and maintenance of the existing 42-inch waterline
- Replacement consists of approximately seven (7) miles of 54-inch waterline and three (3) miles of 48 and 42-inch waterline

Construction \$94.6 million

COLC's Estimated Project Cost Share:

Design, ROW, Technical Services \$10.1 million

Construction \$42.5 million

Current Proposed Completion Schedule:

Design, ROW, Technical Services - FY19 & FY20

Construction FY2021, FY2022, FY2023

Southeast Transmission Water Line Contract Amendment Project Overall Budget (table) \$117,813,000

Untreated Water Reservation Agreement:

- This agreement through GCWA secures 20 MGD untreated raw water capacity acquired from COH
- The 2018 Water Master Plan identified the need of approximately 20 MGD of additional surface water capacity to sustain the City's growth through ultimate build-out
- Quick History

Ouest to secure future surface water for ultimate build-out began in 2012

Funding for Raw Water Reservation Agreement:

Paid annually from Water Operating Budget – Water Contract Purchases account 10207300-53910

Reservation fee is based on 10 percent of COH's raw water rate until completion of SETL FY2020: $\$0.072 \times 20,000,000 \text{ gallons/1,000} \times 365 - \$530,000 (10 \text{ percent of COH's raw water rate})$

Reservation fee increases to 25 percent after completion of SETL, until the expansion of SEWPP is online

 $$0.12 \times 20,000,000 \text{ gallons/1,000} \times 365 = $876,000 \text{ (25 percent of COH's raw water rate)}$

Water Supply Contract for Thomas Mackey Water Treatment Plant does not apply to this agreement and is currently under review and revision to update

Future alternative surface water – Brazos River Authority's system operation permit option water for future consideration
