## 7. <u>COMMENTS/REPORTS FROM MEMBERS OF COUNCIL</u>

Announcements concerning items of community interest. No action will be taken or discussed.

Larry Millican – Thank you, Mayor Pro Tem. Since the Clear Creek Watershed Steering Committee wasn't on the agenda earlier, I'll go ahead and review that meeting that we had this morning now, and I'll reserve my other comments for some other meeting that I have prepared. I started off this morning with a Galveston County Consolidate Drainage District meeting. It started this morning, and the takeaway from it was that on the Imperial Estates to give everybody an update, they're now up to 100,000 truckloads of soil removed. They're at about 65 percent, which gives them somewhere in the neighborhood of 70,000 acre-feet of storage at this point. The other thing is, I reported for the city during that meeting about our championing of the \$60 million in projects that we completed as a city last year. Also, as far as League City and the classification change to a Class 5 from a Class 6 on the National Flood Insurance Program, and that was very well received. Then we had a Clear Creek Watershed Steering Committee meeting this morning, it started at 11:00. The report from it is that there's a large discussion, we've got two projects on Upper Clear Creek that are going on, one is the South Belt Detention, and the other is the Dagg Road Detention Basin that they're building, and there are ongoing discussions about the South Belt Detention, whether it's going to be a wet bottom or a dry bottom. The discussion surrounds Hobby Airport and the birding activity on a wet bottom. Although a wet bottom will hold more water and be able to be utilized a little better, it may run into trouble with that. But at any rate, there's an ongoing discussion and it doesn't seem like it's going to be resolved anytime in the immediate future, but hopefully in the near future. Also, they've also identified a new detention basin. A lot of people may recognize off of 2351 there's been a developer back in the period of time that Friendswood was lingering after Hurricane Harvey with adopting the new guidelines for Atlas 14 and the requirements for flood mitigation they allowed a person to come in and put a lot of fill, acres of fill, on a site fairly close to the creek over in Harris County. A lot of uproar came of that. Eventually, Friendswood corrected some of the activities that was there, and now that's been turned over to the Harris County Flood Control District. They bought that property and have eliminated all of the fill that was on that property and have gone now to the point where they're going to be putting in another detention basin there. Harris County is, and it's going to be about 80 acres in the site, and it's going to hold somewhere around 800 acre-feet of water when the detention pond is built. It's probably got something around a four- or five-year projection as far as getting it engineered and developed. And that is about the end of my report.

Andy Mann – I just wanted to tell Todd again, thanks and I'll miss him. Other than that, I yield my time.

Mayor Pro Tem Hank Dugie – Dickinson Bayou Watershed Steering Committee didn't make it to the agenda, either. I did not send a reminder. Mr. Millican, I thought your meeting was next month? The Dickinson Bayou Watershed Steering Committee met last week, and we passed a resolution in support of the findings and recommendations of the US Army Corps of Engineers, their Coastal Spine Program. What you'll like to hear is the Clear Lake and Dickinson Bayou gates are included in their recommendations. They have extended their public comment period by thirty days, but I think we have an item on the agenda tonight that League City will get their comments in there in support of that activity. I'd like to say welcome back to Larry. I know that you were out sick, and we're glad to have you back. Mayor Hallisey is on the mend. From my latest update, he should be out in the next couple of weeks at the latest. By all accounts, his energy and enthusiasm is returning to him. His love for League City really has never failed. We're excited to have him back. He should probably be able to preside over our next meeting. We also don't want him to rush back, we want him to be sure he's fully healed before he comes back. I had the opportunity to go to a couple of events over the last two weeks. The Mouse King Market, we had over 70 or 80 craft vendors, some food trucks, out at the Blue Building. Very well attended by the public. We also had a tree lighting ceremony and we had the ribbon cutting at the Ghirardi House. It's been pretty busy. We've had good attendance at all of those activities. One thing I've noticed, citizens of League City are doing a great job of wearing masks when they're at a gathering. I really appreciate the fact that people are going out of their way to keep other people at events safe. This Saturday we will be having an event, Happy Holiday Hoopla at League Park. We'll have about 20 craft vendors, some food trucks, some music, Santa Claus and his elves will make an appearance. We're doing an ugly sweater contest, and we're capping it off with a screening of the movie Elf. We hope to see you out there. Please, if you're going to join us, you're encouraged to wear a mask and to do what you can to keep yourself and those around you safe. That's it for me.

Larry Millican - The Clear Lake Area Chamber of Commerce sponsors a boat lane lighting contest every year, and it's been going on 40-50 years, something of that nature. League City is a major sponsor, and it's this weekend, Saturday night. You can view that from a lot of places on land, but one thing that just happened in the last few years, is the boat lane comes up Davis Road Canal now and goes and turns around and comes back out. There's a lot of viewing places in League City now for the boat lane. I wanted to share that.

Mayor Pro Tem Dugie - I did forget to mention, and it's pretty exciting news. This will be our last meeting in this council chamber before it gets renovated. Our next meeting will be December 28 at the Civic Center to canvass the vote of the December 15 Runoff Election. Voting is going on now, we encourage you to get out and vote. Your participation is key. Once we start back up in January, we'll have our meetings in the Civic Center until our Council Chamber renovations are completed.
