Geri Bentley said hello everybody. Thank you for coming. Since our pastor offered prayers and our mayor offered prayers for the folks in Orlando I would also like to ask you to pray for the families that have suffered tragedy this week as well. There was an officer killed in Pearland Sunday in an accident and anytime we lose one in our police community it's a sad day, so I ask that you keep their family in our prayers as well. Thank you, Steve, for your work promoting the City of League City. You do an awesome job. Thank you for that. Our City Manager is going to introduce our new employee but I'd like to say welcome to our new employee. The City Manager will give you all his bio. Thank you all for being here.

Keith Gross said good afternoon and welcome. I wanted to acknowledge at the end of the school year, my 9 year old child Kaitlin has gotten out of school and she had one of the greatest teachers. Her name's Terri Conklin. Terri Conklin not only taught my child but for the last 20 years has been teaching hundreds of children. She made teaching fun. For example my child wasn't too enthusiastic about math at the beginning of the year. At the end of the year, yesterday she would say dad, give me some math problems. Just set it out to me. I'll show you that I can do them. I watched the transition from my child from the beginning of the year to the end of the year and I was dumbfounded because you see, when I got out of school for the summer, it was the greatest thing and I didn't want my parents to throw anymore math homework at me. But she made learning fun. And not only that, for the kids that didn't have an interest in math, she started this program called Math Club and for the majority of the year she showed up 35 minutes before school would start and would provide help and assistance to my child and other children that wanted to be in Math Club. She did that for the entire year and made such an impact on my child that I just wanted to say thanks before all of League City. So, thank you Terri Conklin.

Nick Long said since school's out people are looking for fun things to do that don't cost a lot of money. I'd like to encourage people to go down to the animal shelter and walk dogs and wear pants. I didn't know that was a rule beforehand but it was pretty neat. I got to meet a lot of really energetic dogs which they were really fun. A couple of them we took two at a time for the smaller dogs and let them run in the back and they were crazy. They had really good personalities. Another thing I would like to talk about is the library. My wife took our two kids to the library today and they just got back before I left for the meeting. They were so excited. They went to story time. They came back with a bunch of books. They joined the Reading Club which Mr. Kinsey had told me about and my five year old was already trying to get me to read books with him before I left and I had to tell him that I had to go to this meeting. I'm sure that tomorrow I'll be reading through some Superman books that he had. My wife told me to make a pitch for this Chemistry Road Show. She said it is absolutely the most fun she ever had in college was going to watch the Chemistry Road Show and I told her wow you're college sounds pretty dull then if that's the best thing that happened.

Mayor Hallisey said on Memorial Day I got an opportunity to go out to Fairview Cemetery. There must've been two hundred people plus who showed up for this event at 10:00 in the morning. I wanted to acknowledge the Fairview Cemetery Board of which the new Chairman Mr. John Schoelkopf is here and who did a magnificent job of putting that together that morning. Good guy. As always we want to acknowledge the American Legion Post 554. They were out there in their colors. We were really proud of them. I know that Council Members Long and Bentley were both out there with me that morning. Let me tell you, it was a touching tribute to those who have given the ultimate sacrifice for the freedoms that we live under every single day. I've been wanting to go to the Barracudas swim meet. It's been a long time since I'd been on a pool deck and been a long time since I sweated as much, but it was a pleasurable event at Hometown Heroes Park, Mr. Wei. There must've been 500 children out there with

They downed Friendswood so we were very proud of them and I was happy to be out there with them. I want to say something about Steve Paterson and the Chamber. Last Friday, we had the Chamber Legislative luncheon with Randy Weber our congressman, Larry Taylor our State Senator, and Greg Bonnen our State Representative, and we kind of got an outline of what they're looking at some of the big deals that are happening at the Legislature this year starting in January. League City will be an active part in putting together legislative agenda for things that are important. And remember, you spend a lot of tax money that goes to the State and we would like to get our fair share reinvested back into our community as well as the Federal government. All of them gave great speeches. Also, Janice and I attended the Devereaux fund raiser. Devereaux, as you know, is a treatment care center here in town. It does a lot of work with young people and other people who have problems. We were proud to be there. We were guests of Amoco Federal Credit Union and we thank them publicly for inviting us. As you saw from the first thing tonight, please put your kids in a learn-to-swim program. It doesn't matter whether you go to your neighborhood pool, whether you go to Hometown Heroes or the old city pool or as I found out this week as I traveled around town we have several private pools that teach swimming lesson. We are surrounded by water. It is imperative that our children learn to swim because as the story illustrated tonight, any of us who are parents know that the second we turn our back on our children and they are out

running around, in fact we could lose them real quick. I also am happy to see Poochie Walker here. Poochie is an old friend of mine and those of you who wonder who Walker Street is named after, it's her family. She's a doll. I saw her at Memorial Day. I hadn't seen her in a good number of years and now she comes to council meetings. Good for you. And lastly but not least, please shop at home, eat at home. Every penny you spend within League City solidifies our local economy. League City first. Be League City proud.
