Dan Becker had no comments.

Hank Dugie said thank you, Mr. Mayor Pro Tem. I'll be brief. Thank you everyone for being here tonight. Especially our Boy Scouts over here. Please give them a round of applause. Thank you for being here and being involved. I challenge at least one of you to come out to our next meeting and come up here and say something during the public comment section. You'll get extra credit. I don't know if I'm able to give extra credit but I'm sure that someone can make that happen. I think I speak for everyone on council, we're happy to serve. If you ever have an idea, suggestion, comment, complaint even...I know there's only a few of those in League City...feel free to come up to me, reach out to me on my cell phone or email and I'm happy to assist in any way I can. Thank you.

Larry Millican said thank you, Mr. Kinsey. Just real quick, thanks you everybody for coming. I appreciate the opportunity to listen to the citizens and take what they give us and do something with it. Also, I'd like to bring attention, Frankie said something earlier is that we have a survey going in the Historic District and I don't know how many people know about it and I wanted to make sure that everybody in the city knew about it. We're going through and surveying each of the structures in the historic district and putting a value whether or not that they have a historic value or not to the city. That's very important because the historic district itself is a lot larger than what that downtown project was. It encompasses a lot of homes and a lot of structures and they are going to go through and actually evaluate each and every one of those structures as to the degree of value to the city itself. We are going to be looking at the architecture of it, not only just the age of it, but the architecture of it and if there's been any degradation because of any additions or deletions from those structures. It's going to be a very comprehensive survey that the historic commission itself will be able to take and use for the future as far as evaluating plans or activities that people want to do with other structures in the neighborhood and I just wanted to bring everybody aware of it. I'm sure we've got information on the website about the survey and how intense it's going to be but it's something that I think will be very valuable to the city to get this survey completed and be able to have that first step complete for our historic district. Thank you.

Greg Gripon said I would like to thank everybody for coming out tonight on this amazing night. The Astros have made it to the World Series. I'm pretty impressed to see how many people are here. I did think about calling in sick tonight but I decided to go ahead and come do my duty. On another note, I want to thank our citizens, our prayer warriors out there. It's been amazing all the prayers and community outreach for Pat, our mayor, and I want to say thank you.

Nick Long said I wanted to say thank you to another group of volunteers. The Board of Directors and the volunteers for the League City Little League and the League City Softball Association. Most of you probably don't know but they do all the maintenance of the fields at the Sportsplex and they do an awesome job. A lot of those fields suffered pretty big damage during the storm. Grass doesn't grow too well when it's four feet under water and so they have spent a lot of time rehabbing those fields and getting them to work. Even when there is not a disaster on hand, these guys spend countless hours making sure those fields are ready to play and that is all resources that the City doesn't have to outlay. They really do spend a ton of time and it's been great seeing that effort so thank you to them for doing that stuff and volunteering.

Mayor Pro Tem Todd Kinsey said just a real quick update on the Mayor. He's getting stronger by the day according to his wife, Janice. He's out of ICU and into a regular room and I'm told tomorrow he will actually be transferred to a rehabilitation center so that's excellent news but keep up the thoughts and prayers. I see my two favorite librarians out in the crowd so I'll do that next. On November 4, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. patrons will have an opportunity to honor those who served at "Read Across America - The Veteran's Experience." A short presentation on the novel Billy Lynn's Long Halftime Walk will be followed by a panel discussion with representatives from the Veteran's Peer Network. The Houston Public Library's Irene B. Walters will return on November 6, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. to teach genealogy on the FamilySearch database. Bring your own laptop or tablet. This class will be held in the theater. For the teens, "SherLOCKED" is an escape-the-room activity for Teens, scheduled for Monday, November 13, 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. in the Theater. This event is for ages 13-18. Go Stros!

9A. 17-0650 Presentation of the Hurricane Harvey Update (Assistant City Manager)

John Baumgarter, City Manager, said I want to let the public know, certainly we heard the comments on the drainage tonight. You don't have to wait until a council meeting, you can always call me or email me and we'll take a look at those. Obviously, Hurricane Harvey has brought to our attention some deficiencies within our system. The raining the other night, regarding Brittany Bay, could be just debris in the storm-sewer system, could be a more intensive issue at that. With our CIP this year, we've put some money in there for studies of specific areas. Oaks of Clear Creek would be one of those we want to look at specifically. Again, I just want to encourage the public to contact staff directly if you'd like to, certainly there's nothing wrong with coming to our council meeting and meeting the city council but we can't be on every street and we can't be in every neighborhood so as you see those things take those pictures and send them to us and we'll get the right staff people in contact with you. Bo will give us a quick update on what we're doing on Hurricane Harvey.

Bo Bass, Assistant City Manager, said Mayor Pro Tem, Councilmen and City Secretary, good evening. These get shorter and shorter for good reason because we're getting closer and closer to being through. We've got issues of harm to the heart as well as physical issues to deal with like piping systems and drainage systems but we're close. One hundred and ten thousand cubic yards, as of vesterday by Crowder Gulf. 6,500 cubic yards by Jody Hooks' public works forces. 7,500 cubic yards today by TxDOT. TxDOT's not in the community anymore but I tell you what...they did a heck of a job for us. I would suggest they cut our time down by about 30 days so we were most happy to have them. Crowder Gulf was happy to have them because quite frankly, between Jody and several of us, we put the best tool in the right spot. Crowder Gulf is best at deep concentration so that's where we put them. Our crews are good for onesies and two-sies and small difficult to get to spots. TxDOT is good for lighter materials and long runs so we used the combination quite effectively. We're estimating, and it's just math and estimations, that's 79 percent possibly 80 percent already collected. We started today our final pass, so our last run-through, we're thinking it's going to take about two weeks before Crowder Gulf is cleaned off enough. Well, quite frankly, there's no business for them anymore in the city of League City. Jody's crews are working now and they'll probably work another two weeks after Crowder Gulf so knock on wood, we're looking at about two and a half to four weeks before we're essentially done. Now, there will always be a couple of spots we're missed so if you think we've missed you or you're overlooked, call 311 like you have been and give us your address and I give you my Eagle Scouts honor that we'll respond. Mapping-wise, Rick Brezik and team and the planning staff have been consistently updating the map. It's still out there on the interactive map system on the webpage. You can enter your address and see if you're inside or outside of one of those colors. If your address comes up within the colors, we know you're there. If we haven't been there, we'll get there soon. If it's in one of the areas where it's not colored, please call us and let us know where you are specifically and I'll answer any questions you may have. It's been a great concerted effort and we appreciate the guidance of the City Manager and support of

the council.

John Baumgartner said, one more update for the general public, Galveston County is currently having a bond election. Early voting started Monday, it will go thorugh November 7 or close to that. The General Election is on November 7, so there is a county bond election that is currently being voted on. It's \$80 million worth of bond improvements, including \$56 million for roads, some for facilities and some for drainage. I don't remember the specific amounts, but it totals about \$80 million. \$6 million for drainage. Early voting is ongoing as we speak, then the General Election on the 7th.
