Thank you for being here. I actually, if you were not aware, am a world champion Quidditch Player and just this past weekend I taught a Girl Scout club how to play and they were pretty good. So if you are ever interested in learning how to play just give me a shout and I would love to teach you and maybe we could have the Boy Scouts and the Girl Scouts play in some friendly competition. I have also given some tours of City Hall to different Boy Scout troops so if that is something that you might enjoy than give me a call and we can arrange that. Again, thank you everyone for being here and participating in your government.

Larry Millican said thank you Mayor. I would just like to thank everyone for coming, I appreciate your involvement and don't forget about Valentine's Day tomorrow. It could be a crusher.

Greg Gripon said good evening. As we heard earlier from Anita Butler, League City live oaks are our heritage as you see it up on our emblem here. About three weeks ago I found out that one of our historic registered League City live oaks was going to be cut down. I had heard the tree was coming down but had not realized that it was a historic registered League City live oak, and they even call it a majestic live oak. So I went out there and looked at it and it started bringing back lots of memories of me and my dad out there building the habitat and spending a lot of time out there around this oak tree. It is quite a majestic tree. So some of the citizens got together and talked to me about talking with the school district to see if we could get some time to maybe raise some money. Not taxpayer's money, citizen's money to come together and hopefully move this tree. So I worked with them and we decided that we needed a 501(c)(3). We got with our Patrons of the Park with the City of League City and voted that we could do this. So we brought together Patrons of the Park, The Historic Association, The Garden Club, and the Friends of Mr. Elementree to all come together to try and raise this money. It is a huge goal, it is \$200,000 and we got 30 days. Like John has said, it is \$2 per person in League City, \$7 per family. If we all come together the money could reach \$200,000. And I ask myself what would my father have done, he would have been out there chaining himself to the tree. I am not going that far, and I am definitely working on a positive outcome even if we don't raise the money. There are a lot of things that this money can go towards. We have a lot of beautiful oak trees on Main Street that need care, need fertilization, need pruning. We have many areas in our parks where we could plant new trees, so the money will go to great use. I am also working on some ideas over at the school where the kids could have some heritage of Mr. Elementree, which is the name of this tree. Thank you.

Keith Gross said welcome everybody. Today is a good day because we get to have a council meeting where we can say Five Corners is now Six Corners and it is a working intersection. It is like we should celebrate this day every year because people have been so critical of council for putting this on an agenda and not getting it done. It is finally done, and I have received many reports from people saying that it is moving traffic along a lot quicker. So, Mr. Baumgartner I guess you get the credit for this. Thank you very much and welcome all.

Nick Long said I am happy to report I live right there so I get to drive through it. It makes it slightly better but I think we might still have a little bit more work to do at that intersection. I would like to say happy Fat Tuesday to everybody and wish everybody a happy and blessed season of Lent.

Mayor Hallisey said I have a long list but I am going to run through them. I am happy to see Boy Scouts here. Every time I am in your company I am reminded of what organization takes boys and turns them into great young men and scouting does that. So we are glad you are here. If you come to my office I give you a little pin. I invite all the troops to come so if you decide you want to come, just come on up and see me. Happy Chinese or Lunar New Year. I was surprised before the meeting that that is this weekend. Happy Valentine's Day, be sure and give your sweetheart a valentine or look out for the dog house. Happy Fat Tuesday, the end of Lent. Happy Kwanzaa. All those things are important to people within our communities so take the time to enjoy our diversity in League City and know that it is alive and well. There are so many people that come from different cultural backgrounds and different backgrounds. With that I want to tell you I made the Employee Recognition Luncheon last week, these are people who have worked for us anywhere from 10 years up to 30 plus years. It was kind of eve opening to me that some of those folks have been around 30 – 40 years and I started scratching my head thinking how old I am because I knew them when they came. Anyway, congratulations to them. It is one of the things that makes our employee core first class, is that we keep people for a career, we don't have the constantly re-train and we are proud of all our employees. John Baumgartner, City Manager said I have a few comments. First, we looked at the expenditure savings from last year. We have worked hard to fill our vacancies. I think last hiring period we hired 10 police officers. I don't know what our total is under budget, there still remains a significant amount but that is a significant increase in the number of hires off of a hiring process. Also, tonight I would like to introduce three new employees. Al Turner is our new Purchasing Manager. Anthony Awwad is our new Budget Manager. Fritz Kuebler is our new Assistant Director of Project Management. New key employees to help us continue to accomplish our job. I would also like to comment, last night we had a significant water break. Unfortunately, CenterPoint Energy working to relocate the gas line for I-45 reconstruction somewhere got 5 feet off of alignment and broke a 24-inch water line. It was a big impact both to the traveling public along I-45, tremendous amount of water outages or decreased pressure on both side of I-45 and the southwest side of the city. Our staff responded quickly and got the leak isolated. I believe that we are back to normal pressure throughout the city. We still have to fix the water line and Jody Hooks is working to get that accomplished. As a follow up to Scott Livingston's presentation, on March 20 we would like to have a special council meeting to talk about land use and continue to build on that presentation. As it relates to 5 corners, I would like to take full credit but unfortunately, I can't. We have lots of partners in that throughout the community itself. TxDOT, the various land owners that were impacted worked hard to get that project from an idea to a completion. We are not quite there as Council Member Long indicated. I think most of the time during the daytime it is working effectively. We continue to make adjustments associated with southbound traffic, particularly in the evening. It is still, what I would characterize as pretty miserable if you are coming down from Webster. We are working on completing the markings, getting people familiar with it and ask the public to have patience as we make some timing adjustments. And looking forward to it overall, I think for 80% of the day it is much improved over what it was, and we will continue to make changes to that. And then lastly as it related to Mr. Elementree, Patrons of the Park is the ones taking those donations and they have a YouCaring page where those collections are being taken. That is all I have tonight, Sir.
