Kudos to Mike Kramm and John for getting our legislative agenda set up, I signed the notes today that went up to the legislators on issues that were important to us. It turned out great and I'm going to tell you what I've said to everybody over the last year, we like the Grand Parkway, we'll be happy when the Grand Parkway is done. We don't understand why the Governor and Lt. Governor pulled it. They said they didn't like toll roads, but the Grand Parkway is just a bit outside of what we can afford in its entirety, it's a bit outside what Galveston County can afford. I'll be in a meeting tomorrow with the mayors of the area, it's called the Mayors' Round Table. Our number one objective is to try to get the Grand Parkway going. It'll be on everybody's agenda. It gives us access to the northwest side of Harris County, which if I've listened to Scott, 65% of our working population goes out there. It is a big deal to us, we were very successful last year, Dr. Greg Bonnen and Senator Larry Taylor carried some bills that are paying dividends for us and we want this session to be equally as helpful for us.
