Hank Dugie – I want to thank everyone for coming out tonight. For those who came up to speak, thank you for being here, for being part of government, we definitely are listening. I look forward to continuing the conversation. Not to belabor the point, but also to belabor the point, I think drainage is still on everybody's mind. I was asked by a member of the Dickinson Bayou Watershed Steering Committee to start presenting rainfall data at our committee meetings. I heard today that what used to be considered the average storm we would have 11 inches of rain and today's average storm we have 18 inches. We're also, being a coastal community, experiencing subsidence. So I think we're close to about a foot of subsidence just in recent history, so as we're sinking and rain events are becoming heavier, flooding will only get worse over time. So, I think if 25% of the homes flooded during Harvey, if we don't do anything today it's only going to get worse. So I think it's important that as we get more withdrawn from the event itself, we remember that the issue is still very real and if we don't take action that it will only get worse in the future. I think this Council is committed to making progress and I think the bond election coming up next month is a good first step. I think the community's bought into it. I wanted to make sure we keep belaboring the point if we don't do something it's only going to get worse. I don't want that to be on my conscience.

Larry Millican had no comments.

Greg Gripon – What a beautiful day it was and how wonderful it was that my fellow League City Lions came out and did the Spotlight today. They did a fabulous presentation and thank you for the mug. I do want to say one thing, the Lions this year have really stepped up to make this a community event and I think that's really special. We are about our community and I just want to say Lion Melaine Sweeney has been wonderful in making that happen. I want to invite all of you to come out and have a wonderful time on May 2 through 5 at the League City Music Festival and Barbecue Cook-Off.

Mayor Hallisey - Last weekend was the first weekend I got to rest in probably a year and not having to be somewhere, so with that and the fact that I'm happy about it, and it was a beautiful day and I'm reminding you that April 22 is the beginning of early voting. It's your town, you have to decide how you want it to look. We've gone through some tough times and I know that you will make decisions based on that, so if you didn't flood last time let's hope you continue not to and more and more of this watershed is filling up with concrete, whether it's here, whether it's all the way up to Sugarland and Katy and the rest of it. So this is a big deal for us. It is our effort to take care of internal drainage and what you heard tonight from Ms. Zahler and Mr. Millican and what you hear on alternate times from Mr. Dugie, is that they are hard at it on the regional efforts to try to curb flooding. And there are in the regional point of view a lot more than just de-snagging the creek. It's figuring how to get water out to the bay over the objections of the tides coming in from time to time. But I'm confident they're going to find a way to do it and Mr. Dugie's right. To do nothing is only to invite the same thing back again. All we know how to do is try, there is no answer. We can't get God to tell us that he's going to stop it at 10 inches of rain on any given day in the year. But we've been hit with some pretty hard weather, it's been a cold winter. We're getting out and enjoying the great outdoors. League City has a treasure trove of things for you to go do, whether it be on your bicycle around on the trails, whether it's going out and watching your grandchildren or your children play Little League baseball or soccer or whatever it happens to be. You live in a great community and there's a lot for you to do and for those of you that are sailors, enjoy that water out there. It's going to be warming up pretty quick, you might even want to go swimming before it's over.
