#### **BUCKET 4 – FEMA HMGP 404 & COST SHARE**

Assistance for action taken to prevent or reduce long term risk to life and property from natural hazards.

- Competitive Process administered by the State
- No Direct Storm Damage Required for Eligible Projects
- Limited Funding
- 75% FEMA/25% Recipient Cost Share
- Submitted Approximately 20+ Applications Totaling \$67.1 Million

406 – Larger culvert with concrete wing-walls

404 - New upstream retention pond

#### **BUCKET 5 – CDBG-DR**

- Administered through HUD
- HGAC received \$130M non-housing and \$110M for Houston/Buyouts
- MOD (method of distribution) determined by HGAC
  - Non-Housing \$6.8M
  - Buyouts & Acquisition \$7M
- 100% Grant Money No cost share
- Can be arranged to be used toward FEMA matches
- Project eligibility based on failure to function and/or direct damage
- LMI (low to moderate income) component

#### NAVIGATING THE NEXT YEAR OF RECOVERY ACTIVITY

- Focus is quickly shifting from project formulation to implementation
  - Ensuring that project scopes and procurement of services remain compliant and eligible for maximum funding and a successful close out
- As projects reach completion, Ardurra will:
  - Coordinate the process between TDEM (Texas Dept. of Emergency Management) and FEMA
  - Final review of completed projects to diminish deobligation concerns
  - Complete the project closeout phase of the recovery
- Ardurra staffing and suppler will:
  - Remain responsive to FEMA
  - Utilizing City personnel to lead
  - Ardurra to support where needed
