John Baumgartner – I have a couple of quick announcements. Obviously, talk about Veterans Day on Monday, November 11. Just want to remind folks that City Hall, City Hall Annex, Municipal Courts, the Library, Hometown Heroes Park will be closed on Veterans Day, as well as the Library closed on Sunday. Trash pickup will operate normally on Monday even though the City is closed. On November 12, we're going to have a town hall meeting. We're going to focus a little bit on some of the items we hear from the public they're being the most critical things, so we're going to have a Let's Talk Traffic Town Hall. League City and the Texas Department of Transportation are co-hosting the town hall on Tuesday, November 12 at the Civic Center at 6:30 p.m. There will be a short presentation on current and upcoming traffic mobility projects, followed by a question and answer period. The first 100 attendees will be treated to a complimentary Chick-Fil-A sandwich. Everyone entered into two raffle drawings, one for a pair of Houston Texans tickets, another for a pair of Rockets tickets. On Thursday, November 14, we're going to have another meeting, more open house, regarding understanding your League City water bill. After the financial transition and going through the summer months we've seen a lot of questions out there and want to help the citizens, the customers understand how to access water usage information, water bill, understand the water system and how it gets paid for. In addition to the presentation, we'll have computer terminals with customer service technicians on hand to go over individual bills. What we find in a lot of the water situations is pretty individualized in going through the bills, we are able to look at both daily use, hourly use and able to identify patterns, whether that's a leak or whether it's irrigation, help people understand how to fix their bill. I like to think every time you run your irrigation system, that's \$10, and if you start running your system every third day that could be as much as \$100 a month on your water bill. So, we'll go over that and we'll be there as late as the folks want to stay. We're going to start at 6:30 and hopefully be out of there by 8:00 or so. I think I'd like Kristine to do just a couple of brief statements on the recent bond sale that we had and how the results were. After Kristine is complete, we're going to do our long-awaited budget video. It's about five minutes.
