SENATE BILL 2

Effective Tax Rate > No-New-Revenue Tax Rate Rollback Tax Rate > Voter-Approval Tax Rate

"In a Nutshell"

Pre Senate Bill 2

- If city adopted a tax rate exceeding the rollback rate (8 percent M&O growth), voters could petition for a rollback election.
- Rollback election not held on uniform election date

Post Senate Bill 2

- If city adopts a tax rate exceeding the voter-approval rate (3.5 percent M&O growth, plus "unused increment rate"), city must hold an automatic election.
- Tax rate approval election held on November uniform election date

Unused Increment Rate

- A new component in the voter-approval rate formula
- The 3-year rolling sum of the difference between the adopted tax rate and the voter-approval tax rate
- The city can "bank" unused amounts for up to three years

Example (slide) – In 2023 the city would have an unused increment rate of .01250, which would be factored into the voter-approval tax rate formula.

TRUTH-IN-TAXATION

- Certified taxable value = \$9.72B
- No-New-Revenue Tax Rate = \$0.515708
- Voter-Approval Tax Rate = \$0.5238398
- Due to the increase in taxable value from \$9.10B to \$9.72B the estimated NNR rate went from \$0.535 to \$0.515708
- At the August 11th Council meeting, an agenda item to propose a tax rate of \$0.515 will be presented, which is lower than the NNR rate of \$0.515708
- The FY2021 proposed budget can be funded at the \$0.515 tax rate

TAX RATE ADOPTION

August 18 – Deadline to adopt rate if exceeds VAR & call for election (must adopt budget at same meeting in prior item)

Sunday, August 30 – Publish notice of Tax Rate Adoption (if at or under NNR rate) OR Publish Tax Rate Public Hearing notice (if above NNR rate)

Tuesday, September 8:

- Ratify the Property Tax Increase
- Public Hearing on Tax Rate (only required if tax rate is above NNR rate)
- Adopt tax rate

Tuesday, September 29 - Deadline to adopt tax rate
