2. <u>DISCUSSION REGARDING THE CITY OF LEAGUE CITY PROPOSED FY2022</u> BUDGET AND FY2022-2026 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Presented by Angie Steelman, Executive Director of Finance and Project Management

Budget is prepared in keeping with the Strategic Plan:

- Develop and Maintain our Infrastructure
- Financially Sustainable
- Safe and Desirable Community
- Quality Community Amenities
- Trained Committed and Valued Workforce
- Engaged Residents
- Economic Development and Tourism
- Quality-Built Environment

Top Revenue Sources:

Property Tax – 43% of General Fund Revenue Sales Tax – 27% of General Fund Revenue Water & Wastewater Sales – 97% of Utility Fund Revenue

Estimated Tax Year 2021 Property Values: Taxable Appraised Value \$11.01 billion (slide)

FY 2022 Estimated No-New-Revenue Tax Rate - \$0.465/\$100 valuation (slide)

FY2022 Estimated Property Tax Revenue – General Fund and Debt Service \$49.93 million (slide)

Sales Tax – FY 2006–2026 actual and projected (slide)

Water/Wastewater Revenue, FY 2015-2022 actual and projected (slide)

FY2022 Proposed Budget Expenses

• Includes funding for 2% merit based on performance & 2% cost of living (COLA) raise beginning January 1, 2022.

- An across-the-board 2% cost of living increase for civil service police officers & STEP raises for police officers in accordance with the pay plan.
- Funding for a compensation study in Human Resources.
- Continuation of the Reinvestment Program.
- Anticipated City contribution for employee health insurance at 6% increase.
- An anticipated increase in Solid Waste due to growth in number of households serviced which is offset with refuse collection revenues.

EMT to be hired in January 2022

Paramedic to be hired in January 2022

Two (2) Park Maintenance Workers to be hired in January 2022
