- 2001 Case Backhoe 590M replace with Caterpillar 430F2 Backhoe with extend boom and clamshell

The proposed FY2022 budget does not fund the following requested new item included on the City Manager memo: City Benchmark Program Update (Phase 2 of 2) \$30,000 For FY2021, we have a total of 39 existing Benchmarks within the City

• Locate all 39 control points

• Re-observe up to 11 Control Points – meaning that the elevation will be reestablished at up to 11 sites

• Replace up to 7 Control Points – meaning that any missing/damaged existing control points will be replaced at up to 7 sites

• Establish 1 new Control Point

For FY2022, re-observe/replace the remaining 21 control points and establish 3 to 4 new control points
