ELECTION ORDER

WHEREAS, the City of League City, Texas (the "City"), is a home-rule municipality operating under Article XI, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution, its Home Rule Charter, and the laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Article IV, Section 9 of the League City Charter authorizes the City Council, upon its own motion and by a majority vote of its members, to submit a proposed measure to the voters during a general election; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to obtain the qualified voters' views regarding whether the League City Police Department should continue using automated license plate reader cameras at fixed locations on public roadways for law enforcement purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the proposed ballot language submits the question with definiteness, certainty, and facial neutrality as required by Section 52.072(g) of the Texas Election Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEAGUE CITY, TEXAS, as follows:

Section 1. A special election (the "Special Election") is ordered to be held throughout the City on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, concurrently with the City's general election, for the purpose of submitting one nonbinding advisory proposition to the qualified voters of the City.

Section 2. The City Secretary is authorized and directed to prepare the ballots for the Special Election. The following proposition shall appear on the ballot, with the words "YES" and "NO" printed below the proposition:

“Should the League City Police Department continue using automated license plate reader cameras at fixed locations on public roadways for law enforcement purposes?”

Section 3. The Special Election shall be held under the City's Home Rule Charter, the Texas Constitution, the Texas Election Code (the "Code"), other applicable law, this Order, and the ordinance adopting this Order. Each qualified voter residing within the City is entitled to vote in the Special Election.

Section 4. The City Secretary is authorized to take all actions necessary to conduct the Special Election and to coordinate the Special Election with the City's general election and the elections conducted by Galveston County and Harris County.

Section 5. The City shall contract with Galveston County to conduct the Special Election for voters residing in Galveston County and with Harris County to conduct the Special Election for voters residing in Harris County. Election officers and clerks shall be appointed by the appropriate County in accordance with the Code and the applicable election services contract.

Section 6. Election Day locations within League City include: League City Civic Center, 400 W. Walker St., League City; and Hometown Heroes Park, 1001 East League City Pkwy, League City; and The Crossings, 255 Egret Bay Blvd, League City; and League City Annex, 174 Calder Dr. (Community Rm.), League City; and Public Works Operation Center, 1701 West League City Pkwy, League City; and Education Support Center, 2425 E. Main St., League City; and Magnolia Creek Clubhouse, 4751 W. League City Pkwy, League City; and Bay Colony West HOA, 6621 Calder Dr., Dickinson; TX, 77539.

Section 7. All voting locations shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Section 8. Tabulation of all votes cast within Galveston County will be done at the Central Counting Station located at the Galveston CO Records and Election Center 10000 Emmett F. Lowry Expressway #1152 Texas City, TX 77591. Tabulation of all votes cast with Harris County will be done at the Central Counting Station located at the Elections Operations Center, 15600 Morales Rd, Houston, TX 77032.

Section 9. Dwight D. Sullivan, County Clerk is hereby appointed Counting Station Manager at the Galveston County Clerk's Office. Teneshia Hudspeth, Elections Administrator is hereby appointed Counting Station Manager at the Harris County Clerk's Office. Diana M. Stapp is hereby appointed as general custodian of election records for the City of League City. Such officers and their designees shall have all the authority, duties and responsibilities as denoted in the Code.

Section 10. The City, in accordance with Section 32.002 of the Texas Election Code, may appoint one member of the Signature Verification Committee, the Early Voting Ballot Board, and the Ballot Resolution Board (BRB). The BRB is a non-statutory board that assists the Central Counting Station with the duplication of damaged ballots and email ballots submitted by members of the U.S. armed forces overseas and, where necessary, assists the Presiding Judge of the Central Counting Station in determining the intent of the voter in cases of over votes on mail ballots.

Section 11. The main early voting location for the Special Election shall be held at Galveston CO Records and Election Center at 10000 Emmett Lowry Expressway, Suite 1152, Texas City, Texas 77591; Locations within League City include: League City Annex, 174 Calder Dr. (Comm Rm), The Crossings, 255 Egret Bay Blvd., Public Works Operations Center, 1701 W. League City Pkwy., Hometown Heroes Park, 1001 E. League City Pkwy., and Bay Colony West HOA, 6621 Calder Dr. Such place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, October 19, 2026 through October 23, 2026, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 24, 2026, between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 25, 2026, and between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday, October 26, 2026 through October 30, 2026 for early voting.

Section 12. The early voting location for the Special election for those voters who reside in Harris County shall be determined by Harris County. Such place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, October 19, 2026 through October 24, 2026, between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 25, 2026, and between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday, October 26, 2026

through October 30, 2026 for early voting.

Section 13. Early voting by personal appearance shall comply with Section 61.012 of the Texas Election Code.

Section 14. The early voting clerk's address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail for Galveston County residents may be sent is Attn: Ballots by Mail, C/O Dwight Sullivan Galveston County Clerk, P.O. Box 17253, Galveston, TX 77552-7253, telephone number: 409-770-5108, email address: absenteeballotapplications@galvestoncountytexas.gov, and website: www.galvestonvotes.org. Applications for ballots by mail must be received no later than close of business on October 23, 2026.

Section 15. The early voting clerk's address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail for Harris County residents may be sent is Teneshia Hudspeth, Harris County Elections Administrator P.O. Box 1148, Houston, Texas 77251-1148, telephone number 713-755-6965, email address voters@harrisvotes.com, and website www.harrisvotes.com. Applications for ballots by mail must be received no later than close of business on October 23, 2026.

Section 16. The Mayor shall give notices of the Elections in accordance with the terms and provisions of Section 4.002, et seq., of the Code. Such notices shall state the nature and the date of the Elections, the location of the polling places for each precinct, the hours that the polls will be open and other information required by law. The Mayor shall issue all necessary orders and writs for such Elections, and returns of such Elections shall be made to the City Council and City Secretary immediately after the closing of the polls.

Section 17. The City Attorney shall take such actions as required to have the City in compliance with the Federal Voting Rights Act.

Section 18. It is further found and determined that in accordance with the order of this governing body, the City Secretary posted written notice of the date, place, and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board located in the City Hall, a place convenient and readily accessible to the general public, and such notice having been so posted and remaining posted, continuously for at least three business days preceding the scheduled time of such meeting. A copy of the return of such posting shall be attached to the minutes of this meeting and shall be made a part thereof for all intents and purposes.
